News and Updates

El Updated Service Delivery Guidelines

Following further consultation with IDPH, the IDHS Bureau of Early Intervention (EI) recently released updated EI service delivery guidelines (pdf) that went into effect on June 23, 2021.

Key Takeaways:

- The service delivery method must remain a team (family/caregiver and El provider) discussion that considers the options available and potential risk factors to the family and provider. It is anticipated that inperson service delivery will now be standard practice with exceptions related to team member risk factors/preferences. It is recommended that interventionists who are fully vaccinated support families requesting in-person services.
- With the move to Phase 5, there are no longer limits on the number of families that can be seen inperson by any individual El Provider. Families may have more than one provider in the home (dependent on family consent and comfort level). Individuals in the home should continue to wear masks indoors and if uncertain about the vaccination status of team members. Teams should consider conducting in-person visits outdoors or in well ventilated areas to the maximum extent possible. As always, team members should continue to utilize good handwashing practices and sanitize items that are used across homes before each use.
- Minimize the risk of spreading the virus because children under age 3 are not yet eligible for vaccination, so EVERY family visited has at least one unvaccinated person to potentially spread the virus. New Training on Referral to El

EITP is offering a new online, asynchronous training, Referral to Illinois Early Intervention, that provides an overview of the Illinois Early Intervention (IL EI) referral process and the 3 pathways for children and families to become eligible for IL EI services. Throughout the training, the importance of ensuring strong communication with referral sources and primary care providers throughout the referral process is highlighted as a key factor. You must register and complete in our



referral process is highlighted as a key factor. You must <u>register</u> and complete in our Moodle system to earn 1 hour of EI credit in the area of Working with Families.

New Training on Assessing Infant Motor Development

<u>Pathways</u> in collaboration with EITP has developed a new online, asynchronous training, <u>Infant Development: Alignment, Core, and Motor (IDACM)</u>. This training offers 2 contact hours of EI Credit (1 hour in the Assessment AND 1 hour in the Area of Typical Child Development).



This course is meant to share an understanding of typical motor development at 1, 2, 3, and 4 months of age. At each month, you will see an infant examined in 5 different positions highlighting typical expectations for baby in relation to specific areas of the body, head, trunk, upper extremities, and lower extremities. The importance of placing a baby in each position and the goals of development in that position is explained. This course provides information to help guide you through the sessions, questions to ask, and tips on getting the caregiver involved.

Telehealth Legislation in Illinois

On 5/31/21 both Houses in Illinois have passed <u>House Bill HB3308</u> aimed at amending the Illinois Insurance Code and expanding the use, access, and coverage of telehealth services in the state. The bill is expected to be signed by the Governor, and the Illinois General Assembly has the <u>bill status</u> and <u>full text</u> of HB3308 available to learn more.



Illinois Service Coordination Initiatives

- Statewide and Regional Activities EITP continues to participate in monthly Regional CFC Support
 Meetings, which have led to new ideas, shared resources, cross-regional collaboration, and the
 development of new tools and resources. Recent topics of interest across regions include child find,
 referrals from DCFS, and planning for a return to the office and in-person visits.
- IL SC Forum Special thanks to Katie Nicoloff (CFC 21) for facilitating an informative discussion on virtual
 meeting facilitation during this quarter's meeting. Service coordinators and those who support them at the

- Evaluation of the IL SC Communities Over the summer EITP will conduct an evaluation of the Regional CFC Support Meetings and the IL SC Forum in an effort to understand what community of practice members value and to help plan for future meetings and activities.  - Transition Calculator (Excel file)- enter the child's birthday into the calculator to get the exact dates for meetings from the Transition-Discharge Schedule; printable schedule is included in this file.
 - Transition Timetable (pdf) visual aid to identify the month when transition needs to begin (i.e. 6 months before the 3rd birthday) for a child based on their birth month

State Systemic Improvement Plan (SSIP) Update

The Leadership Teams continue to provide assistance to those who are directly supporting families by providing opportunities for knowledge and skill growth while also creating a safe place for reflecting on challenges. Leadership team members are piloting a practice fidelity tool. The feedback from those piloting the tool will be used for further refinements.

The report that is due to the Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) detailing our progress was submitted in a timely fashion. Though we weren't able to use the template provided by OSEP, we did utilize the same format to acquaint ourselves with what will be needed in the future. We anticipate bringing stakeholders together in the coming fiscal year to assist with planning.
